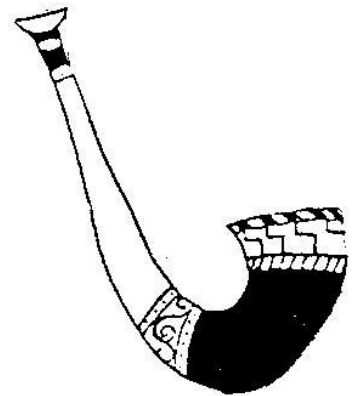
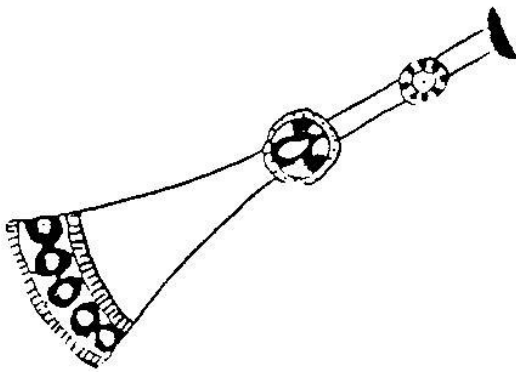
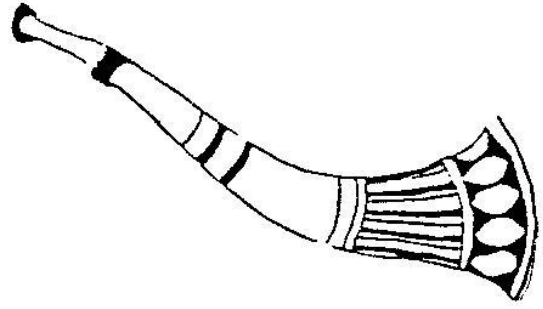

The optional burial insurance premium has been set independently by the Joint Jewish Burial Society (JJBS) and therefore was not under the control of the synagogue. The subscription rates for single, family and 18-30 memberships and for the optional JJBS burial insurance scheme has been included in the letter to be sent to all members.

As the Shul is a Charity and therefore eligible to received Gift Aid, please ensure that you complete the box on your subscription letter which will Gift Aid your subscription. This increases the value of your subscription by 25% and allows the Shul to reclaim the basic rate of tax on your subscription at no extra cost to you.

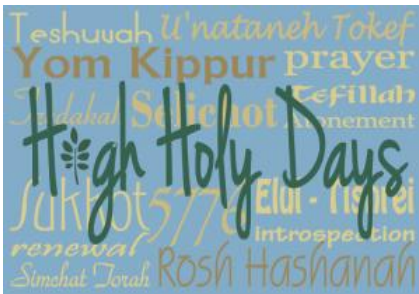

This year, we are delighted to announce that the High Holy Day Services will be conducted by a team of the Shul's Lay Readers supported by members providing readings during parts of the Services. # *SYNAGOGUE COUNCIL MEETING*

## *28 July 2017*

**Present:** Andy Harbert (Chair), Joanne Kearsley (Secretary), Phil O'Driscoll, Audrey Sugarman, Henry Goldstone, Malcolm Rosenberg, Elaine Winetroube and Ian Sugarman (Life President).

### **Business**

The Chair welcomed the newly-promoted Council members to his first meeting as the new Chairman and, on behalf of the Council, expressed his condolences to Henry, who had recently lost his brother-in-law, Leon Pliener. The Council wished Henry "long life".

Ian informed the Council that Sarita had collected the Siddurim which had been ordered in remembrance of Geoff Annis and that he would be inscribing them in memory of Geoff. Deborah Wrapson had purchased a 'non-kosher replica' Sefer Torah to enable the teaching of school children on their visits to the Shul. This would prevent the actual Seferim being used for demonstration, thus minimising potential damage.

The Chair reported that there had been a good turnout for this month's Friendly Circle which had been held at the Pryme Street Shul. He felt that the recent AGM had gone well, without any dramas, and had been well attended. The Chair confirmed that Beal Homes Ltd had now finished using the Shul car park and, as agreed, had painted all the building's eaves and soffits, and had varnished all the doors, as payment 'in kind' for the Shul's co-operation. He estimated that this would have cost the Shul over £1000 if the work had been charged. He also confirmed that Beal intended to also clean the car park at their earliest convenience.

The Chair informed the Council that the late Warren Winetroube had gifted a large sum to the Shul. It was suggested that some new Sefer Torah silverware could be bought and inscribed to honour his memory. Those present approved the suggestion and Ian agreed to look into potential suppliers and to find out the cost.

In the Treasurer's absence, Ian reported that the Shul finances were healthy. An invoice had been received from Sadofsky's for their auditing services and letters were in the process of being sent out to all members and friends of the Shul for the 2017/18 membership subscriptions.

Audrey reported although the Shul catering and refreshment rota was running smoothly, she was always in need of new large teapots as the current ones were starting to leak. Ian suggested the Shul should consider installing an instant continuous hot water boiler, which would be safer than lifting big teapots or having to heat up free-standing boilers. The Chair agreed to look into the costs and report back at the next meeting.

Audrey suggested that hand cleansing gel should be available on entering the Shul. The suggestion was approved and the Chair agreed to find out more details. The Council decided that this year's High Holy Days appeals would be for Leo Baeck College. A special Kiddush would be arranged by the Council to commemorate Ian standing down as Chairman of the Shul.

**The Northern Learning House (NLH)** is an informal network of Reform individuals in communities in the north and beyond who want to commit to learning and supporting their communities. Run by Sherry Ashworth and Sarita Robinson the NLH is funded by Reform Judaism's Community Development Fund. Places are heavily subsidised to a registration fee of £60 per year which covers not only as many courses as you have time to take, but also a residential Shabbat where you can meet fellow students, as a considerable part of our teaching is online, in order to extend our reach as far as possible.

The NLH is designed as a 2 year programme however can be completed in one year if you wish. As the NLH is completely designed to respond to the needs of our communities none of the courses are obligatory – if you wish to pick and mix modules from each year, or just choose one, you are more than welcome to simply register and indicate which course(s) you would like to do. Courses include Intro to Service Leading, Writing Divrei Torah, Leading Shivah & Pastoral Care and Leyning for beginners and intermediate.

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## HIGH HOLY DAYS MESSAGE RABBI LAURA JANNER-KLAUSNER



*As Senior Rabbi to the Movement for Reform Judaism, Laura is a familiar face – and voice – in the media. She is a regular contributor to BBC Radio 4's 'Thought for the Day' and makes regular appearances on other programmes.*



Another year has come and gone; on a national level, this past year has not been our best. Conflict, deprivation and division continue to play huge roles, not just many miles away, but also right on our doorstep. It might be hard to see initially what there might be to celebrate about the past year, but we simply cannot succumb to cynicism. If there is one thing for sure we can celebrate about the year just gone, it is our resilience.

Some of the most memorable and uplifting events of the year have come against negative backdrops as our community, our nation and our world have proven time after time that we have tremendous reserves of resilience. It is at times where we need strength that community takes on a new level of importance. As we say as we reach the end of reading each book of Torah: we are strong and we strengthen one another - *chazak v'nitchazek*.

Each of us is lucky to be part of a community which strengthens us, supports us and gives us meaning. Across the country, Reform Judaism is connecting people to our spirituality and to each other. We too have shown great resilience and reason for positivity and celebration as we face the year ahead. The recent Jewish Policy Research report which caused much concern across the UK Jewish community with its findings that Jews are increasingly leaving synagogue communities behind also showed the stability and strength of Reform Judaism. We are bucking the trend and remaining steady against the tides of decline of the non-Haredi community.

Together, we form a national community worthy of celebration.

We should celebrate the many amazing indicators that our community has a very bright future ahead. I am privileged to have the opportunity to travel around Britain, seeing for myself the vibrancy of Reform Judaism in every corner of the country. Everywhere I go, there are synagogue communities doing amazing work: spreading learning, caring for one another and inspiring the next generation in the chain of tradition. It's a great joy to work in partnerships with synagogues to enable our national movement to thrive. In every place, I see the same willingness to evolve and strive to do even better.

Our overall success as a movement is a product of that desire to never stand still, that belief that there is always more that we can do to bring our Judaism to life. In the year ahead, our movement is ready to do even more.

What can you expect from us in the year ahead? We're bringing on-board new staff to help deliver in some key areas of importance during the year ahead. Already we have our ground-breaking young person's mental health and wellbeing officer, an invaluable support in an area which has become ever more important with the sharp increase of mental ill-health among our young people.



We are also adding a new Young Adult Worker and Student Chaplain to help boost provision for students and young adults seeking their own meaningful path to connect with Judaism, in our existing congregations and meeting them where they are. Ensuring there is a route for our 18-35 year olds to find their place in our communities is vital to maintaining our stability as a movement long into the future.

Strengthening our nation-wide community and every individual community within it remains our top priority. We have launched the process of forming a Covenant which will link together our communities, clergy and professional staff, articulating and defining what it means for all of us to be part of one national movement. The process of shaping a document for consultation this will take place throughout the year, leading to our biennial Chagigah in 2018. The principles of covenantal relationship and duty to one another are core principles we hold as Jews - it is only right we make them a core part of our Reform Judaism. Our initiatives to strengthen communities will continue, including a new initiative to be launched focussing on maintaining financial resilience in our communities.

As a new year is upon us, we consider our deeds from the past year and carry out some *cheshbon nefesh* - a personal accounting. There will always be more we can and will do, but we should look back and be proud of the resilient and vibrant community we have built together. I pray that 5778 will only be sweet, calm and creative year. *Shana Tova U'Metukah.*

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## *PUBLIC RELATIONS WORK*

I was reminded of this most important work, on our recent visit to Jersey, when we visited the Synagogue. As mentioned in my article about our visit, the Secretary was preparing to talk to a group of non-Jewish children about Judaism and its relevance in today's world.



I have said previously, but am still not sure how many people in the Community realise, even now, the work done behind the scenes, so to speak, in order to present Orthodox and Reform Judaism and the Jewish Community of Hull, to the wider public of Hull and the East Riding.

Sharon Dysch, Anna Grantham, Joanne Kearsley, Avril Sugarman, Deborah Wrapson, Andy Harbert, Prof, John Friend, Ian Sugarman, Phil O'Driscoll, Peter Altoft, Chis Lilley and others, speak about Judaism to Primary and Secondary schoolchildren, as well as students in Years 12 and 13 and also adult groups.

I attended the "Living Faiths Day" on July 14, at Cottingham High School and Sixth Form College. The many students involved in the "Living Faiths" sessions, are able to ask questions about **all** the different faiths represented, including as well as Orthodox and Reform Judaism, Church of England, Methodist, Islam, Sikhism, Quakers, Buddhism, the Baha'i faith, Jehovah's Witness and non-faith, Humanism.

All, are owed a debt of gratitude, by all of us, working to put forward the positive teachings of Judaism, that filter out into the wider community, in so many varied ways.

This work, done by such committed people from **both** our Synagogues, is more important today than ever before, as the community at large, is living in dangerous times, for all.

Memorial prayers for the deceased will be recited during the Friday Night Service for those Yahrzeits which fall during the coming week. If a Yahrzeit falls on a Friday Night, please remember that the prayers will usually be recited during the Friday Night Service the week before.
