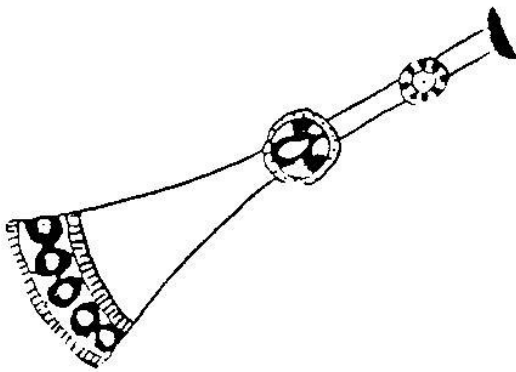
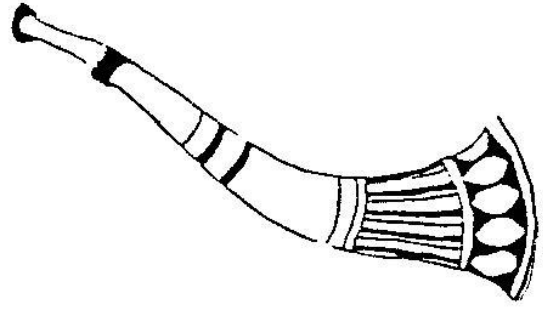

Shalom. We had a good 'turn out' from the members of Ne've Shalom at the Communal Remembrance Service at Pryme Street on 11 November 2018. It was also good to see one of our members, Andrew Percy MP, as one of the invited guests. Our Treasurer, Aimi, has been able to draw down some funding from the CST to provide much needed security for Shul Services. In light of this, we now have appointed a security company for Ne've Shalom and a qualified security guard will be present at our Friday Night and Shabbat Morning Services. They will be patrolling the grounds and ensuring no untoward visitors gain access to the Shul. Humberside Police will also continue to be in the area during the Services.

The Headstone Consecration for the late Thelma Kelsey took place at Tranby Lane Cemetery on 25 November 2018. Thank you to Sarita for leading a moving service. 'Long life' to all the family and friends. Also on Sunday 25 November 2018, in the afternoon, we dimmed the lights in the Shul Hall to watch the film "Sixty Six" in which Bernie Reuben's Barmitzvah clashes with the 1966 World Cup. We managed to fill over 25 seats and thanks go to Ian for being our projectionist and Aimi for acting as the usherette. We have plans for another film show towards end of March 2019, so watch this space.

TU B'SHEVAT SEDER



Tu B'Shevat, the New Year for Trees, falls on the 15th of Shevat. Jewish tradition marks the 15th of Shevat as the day when the sap in the trees begins to rise, signalling the earth's awakening from its winter slumber, and heralding the beginning of Spring. This mini-holiday is of major importance to our appreciation of Nature and our relationship to it.

To celebrate this festival, there will be a Tu B'Shevat Seder held on **Sunday evening 20 January 2019** starting at **7.00pm** at which we will drink wine, eat fruit and sing songs. Everyone is welcome to attend and join in.

HOLOCAUST MEMORIAL DAY 2019



This year's event will be held on **Sunday 27 January 2019** at **2.00pm** at the **Guildhall, Hull**.

We are privileged to have a Klezmer Group coming from Sheffield, who will sing the story of the Holocaust. They will present a programme of live music led by Yiddish singer Phil Tomlinson and his Klezmerim in commemoration of those who were murdered in the Holocaust, and all those who have suffered from genocide, war and persecution. These will include Jewish songs from the Holocaust, with a particular focus on songs that were composed or performed in the ghettos that preceded the Nazi death camps.

These songs are intermingled with traditional tunes, together with brief readings. Translations will be provided for the songs and readings. Together the programme conveys life, love, loss, despair, nostalgia, resistance and hope.

In addition, we shall have three students from the Irene Sendler School, the Polish school in Hull, to give a short presentation of the theme for this year, which is 'Torn From Home'.

FORTHCOMING EVENTS

ANNUAL OPEN FRIDAY NIGHT SERVICE



Following the huge success of previous Open Friday Night Services, the next one will take place on **Friday 22 February 2019** starting at **7.00pm**.

What makes this Service different from the normal Friday Night service is the running commentary from those leading the Service explaining the nature of the prayers being recited, their background, origin and the traditional rituals being observed.

After the Service, and following the Brachot over the wine and bread, there will be the Kiddush with a wide range of "Jewish-style" foods. There also will be opportunity to look around the Synagogue, talk to those members present and examine the Ark, Scrolls and other artefacts.

Following our recent successful film showing of "Sixty Six", there will be a showing of the film "Yentl" in the Shul hall at the Ne've Shalom Synagogue.



Rebbe Mendel (Nehemiah Persoff) is a single father who teaches the Talmud, a sacred text of Judaism, to the boys of his small Polish town. Behind closed doors, he also instructs his daughter, Yentl (Barbra Streisand), despite the fact that girls are forbidden to study religious scripture. When Yentl's father dies, she still has a strong desire to learn about her faith - so she disguises herself as a male, enrolls in a religious school, and unexpectedly finds love along the way. SYNAGOGUE COUNCIL MEETING

14 December 2018

Business

The Chair reported that he had now arranged with Chris for a light with a movement-sensor to be installed above the Shul entrance to make it easier for people to see the key pad in the dark. Malcolm showed the Council images of the windows at Dove House Hospice which contained resin-stained glass to imitate stained-glass windows. Although no-one at the Hospice knew the name of the company that originally installed the windows, Malcolm offered to contact a 'stained glass studio' on Spring Bank West in Hull to see whether they could provide further information and advice on costs.

The Chair reported that he had received a letter thanking him and the other Shul members who had attended the Northern Network Meeting in Southport, at which Ian had been unanimously elected as the Northern Chair. There had been a good attendance of Shul members at the recent Communal Remembrance Service. The film 'Sixty-Six', shown in the Shul Hall on 25 November, was attended by 25 members and friends and everyone thoroughly enjoyed it. The Chanukah Service and social evening held on Saturday 8 December was very well attended and enjoyed by all. The Chair thanked Aimi, Ian and Audrey for all their efforts in making both events so successful.

The Chair also reported that following the recent tragedy in Pittsburg, USA, the CST were providing Government-sourced funding to Shuls to enable them to access local security services. The CST had allocated the Shul funding until the end of March 2019 and would pay the costs on a monthly basis. Due to there being an immediate application date, the Chair had made an executive decision to accept the funding and had contacted a local security company, Humber Watch Limited, to provide security for all Friday Night and Shabbat Morning Services. All security costs would be paid by CST. The Council thanked the Chair for his swift and decisive action.

Finally, the Chair reported on the Radio Humberside interviews undertaken by Aimi and him and by Ian to explain the Festival of Chanukah.

The Tu B'Shevat Service would be held on Sunday 20 January 2019 at 7.00pm and the next Open Service would be held on Friday 22 February 2019, also at 7.00pm. On Wednesday 20 March 2019, the Purim Service would be held, starting at 7.00pm. The next film show in the Shul Hall would be held on Sunday 24 March 2019 at 2.00pm and the Council agreed that film to be shown would be "Yentl", starring Barbra Streisand.

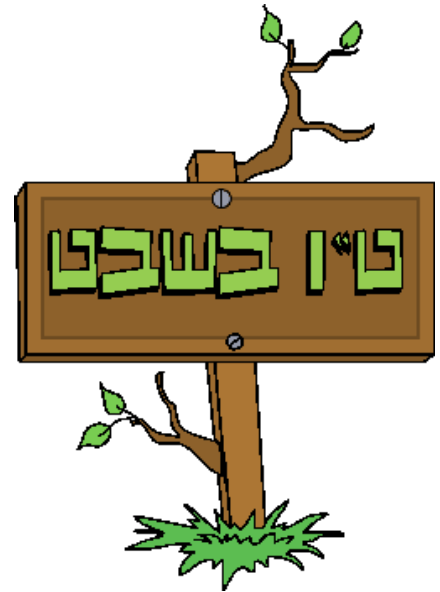

INSIGHTS AND CUSTOMS OF TU B'SHVAT

Tu B'shevat is a holiday that is not a holiday, or perhaps, more correctly, a non-holiday that is a holiday. Unlike all of our holidays, there are no proscribed customs and prohibitions associated with this day, except we do not say tachanun, a prayer in which we beseech G-d for his mercy which is recited immediately after the silent Amidah, the standing prayer. There is also the custom of eating a new fruit and many have developed the custom of eating fruits which the Torah mentions in conjunction with the praise of the Land of Israel.



Tu B'shevat is not mentioned in the Torah. It is mentioned in the Mishnah which tells us that there are four Rosh Hashanahs.

The first day of Nisan is the Rosh Hashanah for the counting of the years of the reigns of the kings of Israel. Meaning that when it says in the second or third year of the reign of king so-and-so, it counts these years from the first day of Nisan. In addition, the first of Nisan, is considered the beginning of the first of the three pilgrimage festivals: Passover, Shavuot, and Sukkot.

The second Rosh Hashanah is the first day of Elul. This is the first of the New Year for the tithing of animals. All animals which are born before the first day of Elul are tithed together, whereas animals born from the first of Elul and afterwards are placed in a separate group to be tithed. This means that an animal born in one year may not be taken as a tithe for an animal born in a different year.

The third Rosh Hashanah is the first of Tishri. This is the date that we all know as Rosh Hashanah. Not only is it the Rosh Hashanah for all mankind, but also the counting of Shmitah (the sabbatical year) and the Jubilee year (the fiftieth year).



Tu B'shevat, which unlike the others does not start on the first of the month, but rather the fifteenth, is the Rosh Hashanah of trees. This applies to the different tithes which were obligatory during the time of the Temple, and now as a Rabbinical commandment. The sages have reckoned that the fifteenth of Shevat is the border date in regard to fruits. Fruits which have realized a third of their growth by Tu B'shevat are tithed on the previous year. Fruits which have not reached a third of their growth by Tu B'shevat are tithed on the following year.

The sages explain that by the fifteenth of Shevat the soil is saturated with the rains of the passing winter so that growth is assured for the New Year. Therefore any tree planted before Tu B'shevat is considered as belonging to the previous year.

Since Tu B'shevat is related to trees and the fruits of the tree, the custom in Israel is to plant trees on this day.

Many however see in Tu B'shevat mystical references to deep kabalistic secrets. There are three elements necessary for the production of fruit: soil, water and a tree. The soil has the power to grant trees the ability to grow and give fruit. The tree has the ability to make use of the power of the ground to create specific fruit, an apple tree will give only apples and an orange tree will produce only oranges even though they are in the same soil. But neither the tree can produce fruit, nor can the soil give power to grow unless the ground is saturated with water.

Once the ground has water in it, it is the catalyst for the ground to supply the power to the tree and for the tree to draw up the minerals and moisture through its sap to produce from the earth a sweet and beneficial fruit.

This is comparable to a person, since the Torah compares a person to a tree. Three things are needed for a person to give forth the fruit for which they was created: the Mitzvot. First, the ground is needed for a person to live upon, which produces all of a person's needs. The second is the person themselves, who must take from the ground material to make a mitzvah. But without the third ingredient, the word of G-d, nothing can start. It is difficult for a person to take a rock or a cucumber and perform a mitzvah.

The mystical sages told us, that the word of G-d fell down into the earth when G-d began to create the worlds. This is called by the cabalists as "tohu". Now tohu has a tremendous power. Like the power of the atom in uranium, this power consists of holy sparks, "nitzuzim" which fell down to the lowest level during the six days of creation. Since then, G-d has given us the Torah which is compared to water. Through the Torah we are able to reach down to the material and elevate it up. This is the mitzvah; this is the fruit of a person's creation.

Since it is the land of Israel that we yearn for and love, we combine the two: the fruits and the mitzvahs. We find new fruits that we have not yet eaten this year and we make the blessing "shecheyanu", *"Blessed are You, Lord our G-d, the King of the universe, who has kept us in life and provided us with sustenance, that we have come to this time."*

In this manner we combine the aspect of the tree, which is giving its best, its fruit, to the aspect of man giving his best, the mitzvah of the recognition of G-d's goodness in our world.
