




HIGH HOLY DAYS 5779

This year, we are delighted to announce that the High Holy Day Services will be conducted by a team of the Shul's Lay Readers supported by members providing readings during parts of the Services. All Services will take place at Ne've Shalom, the Hull Reform Synagogue, Great Gutter Lane (West) in Willerby and members are reminded that **all Services will start promptly.**



Although admission to these Services is open to all it is intended to continue the procedure by which only members, and people known to members, are admitted in to the Shul. It would be much appreciated, therefore, if members bringing guests, or out-of-town family could inform the Shul Secretary, Joanne Kearsley, on (01724 340506) in good time prior to the day of the Service, as this might save any embarrassment on the day.

This year we are again asking those attending to confirm their ID by giving their name and address to the Security Officer at the door of the Shul.

Once the Service has started, the gates to car park will be locked and the Security Officer will be patrolling the grounds. If required, they can unlock the car park gates. The outer door to the Shul will also be secured and the CCTV will be used to identify late-comers.

10 August 2018

Business

Following the fitting of the new lock for the outer door, it was brought to the Council's attention that a number of members were in possession of the 4 digit pass code, even though it was agreed that the pass code would only be given to Council members. It was agreed to change the pass code and only give it to those members requiring access outside of Service times.

The Chair welcomed Shirley Cassidy to the Council as a co-opted member. He remarked how smoothly his first AGM had gone and thanked everyone for their support. He confirmed that Malcolm had taken over the role of Senior Warden and Audrey had reverted back to a Council member. The Chair then stressed the importance of confidentiality and stressed that all information discussed at the Council Meetings must not be discussed outside the meeting, unless agreed by the Council. The Chair also reported on his attendance at Chagigah with Helen, Aimi and Ian and read out the agreed directives for all Reform Shuls. These were to ensure a significant recycling of plastics and the creation of a gender-neutral toilet. The Council agreed to purchase a bin for plastic recycling and to designate the disabled toilet as gender-neutral. The Chair also reported attending a meeting with Ian at the Humberside Police Forum to discuss what assistance could be provided to support the Hull Jewish Community.

The Food Safety Sub-Group reported that they had discussed the banning of home baking and recommended that food be either prepared in the kitchen or be shop-bought. The Council felt that this should be adopted to ensure food safety, but suggested that the Food Safety Sub-Group consider the challenges surrounding the Communal Seder and the Open Service.

Gill Drummond's Affirmation to the Faith Ceremony will be conducted by Rabbi Danny Rich which will take place during the Shabbat Morning Service on 1 September. The Shul's Heritage Open Day is set for Sunday 9 September 2018 between 10.00am - 4.00pm. The High Holy Days will start with Erev Rosh Hashanah on Sunday 9 September at 7.00pm, followed by Rosh Hashanah on Monday 10 September 2018 at 10.30am. Kol Nidre starts on Tuesday 18 September at 7.00pm and the Yom Kippur Service starts on Wednesday 19 September 2018 at 11.00am. The Sukkot Service will be on Sunday 23rd September at 7.00pm and the Simchat Torah Service will be on Sunday 30 September 2018 starting at 7.00pm. There will be another planned film showing on Sunday 25 November 2018 at 2.00pm. The film is entitled "Sixty-Six".

This year's High Holy Day appeal would be the Reform Movement's Communities that Care initiative. Information regarding the appeal would be published in the next edition of the Shofar Shalom. Following a brief discussion, it was proposed that Chris Lilley and Gillian Smith be offered Chatan Torah and Kallah B'rasheet respectively for this year's Simchat Torah honours. This was unanimously agreed. The Chair announced that the Shul cleaning had already started and once all the unwanted 'clutter' had been disposed, the building will be professionally cleaned throughout.

Reform Judaism High Holy Day Appeal 5779

Mental health problems are often hidden in our communities. We believe that all communities should be safe, welcoming and open to everyone experiencing these challenges; there is a demand for our communities to be attuned to individuals' mental health and wellbeing needs. On the High Holy Days we look beyond the surface at things we don't normally see or choose to look at; and in our communities we know that mental health problems affect so many of us but often they are not seen or we choose not to show them.

Reform Judaism together with our communities have launched a new project as part of our Communities that Care Initiative, focussing on mental wellbeing over the next two years; which will deliver practical ways for us to become a mental wellbeing friendly community. Throughout the year we will raise awareness; support welfare and care committees; identify training needs in partnership with mental wellbeing experts; hold a national conference on mental wellbeing with keynote speakers and workshops; and provide practical guidance about the variety of issues around mental wellbeing.

We would love to partner you on this journey in building safe, welcoming and non-judgmental spaces for all of the people struggling with their mental wellbeing.

This is tzedakah in its best sense and your contribution will double the impact of our work.

High Holy Day Message 5779

Senior Rabbi to Reform Judaism

Our values are even more necessary this coming year.

What was 5778? It was a mixture of challenges and responses. Internationally, we witnessed the continued rise of populism, and a worrying redefining of the meaning of Israel as a “Jewish State”. We saw the sidelining of rights for minorities and hostility towards any expression of Judaism outside the norms of Israel’s Orthodox Chief Rabbinate. We have upheld a healthy tension between our love for Israel and our criticisms of it, and have spoken out against policies like these.

In the UK, the anti-Semitism scandal at the core of one of our major political parties meant that many members of our community went onto the streets to demand the respect we deserve. However, some members of our own Jewish community have not given each other this respect, and instead have unleashed some of the most vile abuse our community has ever seen inside itself.

In 5779, our progressive voices will need to be stronger than ever. We continue to raise ourselves up, strengthen and reaffirm our progressive values and inspiring communities. It is exactly the right time for our message as Reform Jews - our message of equality, the opportunity for change and the proper use of political power.

I’m writing this message from Wales surrounded by some of our 200 inspirational and dedicated RSY-Netzer leaders as they prepare to give hundreds of participants a formative experience on Shemesh, our UK summer camps. This summer, we sent seven packed tours to Israel! We have a great deal to be proud of and reason for confident optimism for our future.

From spending time with our members of all ages, I know that there are pressures from within, as well as externally. Research shows that two-thirds of us will experience mental ill-health in our lifetimes, and the challenges presented by this are hidden in all of our communities. We know that our communities need to be places people can turn to for support and comfort, no matter what is ailing us. This is why 5779 is our first High Holy Days with a dedicated mental health and wellbeing provision and why we plan, with your help, to do more to look after each other in communities.

These High Holy Days, we are raising tzedakah to support the Communities that Care initiative to keep our Movement at the forefront of national mental health care. At Chagigah, we committed to promoting the NHS’s recommended five steps to mental well-being in our communities and raising awareness of mental ill-health in our society.

During the next two years we will continue our partnerships in congregations, enabling us to be safe communities, welcoming and open to all people with mental well-being problems. A national conference on mental wellbeing and bespoke training with mental wellbeing experts will provide the highest level of support and training possible for every community. We hope that you and your community will consider supporting our appeal and help to make a big impact on this challenge.

These aspirations rely on our synagogues, which remain the heart of Reform Judaism. This year saw the launch of a new initiative: 'Money for Values - Re-thinking Synagogues' Engagement and Finance'. Designed to help synagogues consider new models of financial stability, Money for Values looks at membership models, and fundraising and budgeting that reflect the priorities and values of the community. Our members should feel they are contributing to a Judaism that brings them meaning, rather than feeling that they are buying a product or service.

Pirkei Avot (Ethics of the Fathers) teaches us that the world stands on three things - Torah, service and acts of loving-kindness. So too does Reform Judaism rely on our three vital components: our vibrant congregations, our inspirational clergy and the partner in leadership of the central movement structure. 5779 will be the year of the Covenant. The new Reform Judaism Covenant will strengthen our Movement by communities, clergy and Reform Judaism defining ways in which each of us as partners in leadership rely on each other. It will define our commitments and expectations. Just as the relationship between God and the Jewish People enshrined in the Covenant has been central to Jewish history, our Covenant will be central to Reform Judaism nationally.

When we reach the end of one book of Torah and start the next, we say chazak, chazak v'nitchazek - be strong and strengthen one another. As we reach the end of this year and start the next, it is this spirit I hope we capture as we develop our bold initiatives. Now is a time for every part of our Movement to be strong and to strengthen one another. The Reform Judaism Covenant hopes to give us all the framework in which to achieve this. Now, more than ever, we need that strength. Our place in British Jewry and society at-large has never been more critical. The values we bring are an antidote to some of the great challenges around us today. Our voice has never been more important: let's work together better than ever to amplify it.

If the Hebrew date is observed, it must be remembered that the Yahrzeit starts the evening before.

Memorial prayers for the deceased will be recited during the Friday Night Service for those Yahrzeits which fall during the coming week. If a Yahrzeit falls on a Friday Night, please remember that the prayers will usually be recited during the Friday Night Service the week before.
